ATHLETIC CLEARANCES

Before trying out for a sport, you must be cleared!

Clearances for athletics is a two-step process:

1st step: On-line. Students must do the on-line clearance process which can be found at:

www.chulavistaspartans.com

You must have insurance to participate in high school athletics. If you don't have insurance, it can be purchased with Meyers-Stevens through the ASB.

2nd step: Students must have a current physical. Physicals must be done in the United States. Physicals by a chiropractor are not accepted. A physical is good for one calendar year.

CLEARANCE HOURS

During the school year: Beginning 7/24/17 for Fall Sports, 10/2/17 for Winter Sports, 12/4/17 for Spring Sports

Clearances are done after school in room 1836 with the Athletic Director, Craig Wilson, from 2:45-4:00 p.m.

DIRECTIONS

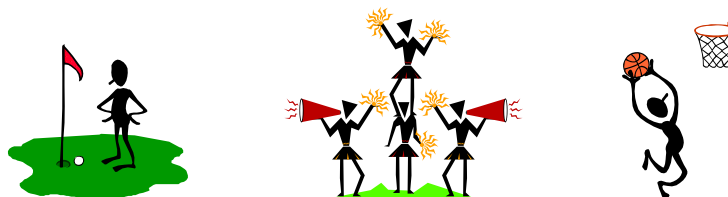
1. Bring your on-line confirmation page (the page with the e-signatures) with your current physical to room 1836 after school.
2. Purchase an ASB Card (optional)
3. If everything's ok, You can participate in try-outs and practice
4. The Athletic Director will check your grades and residency for eligibility
5. If you're eligible, you can participate in scrimmages and games.

PAYING FOR ATHLETICS

ELIGIBILITY

All athletes must meet the following academic requirements to be eligible to play any sport.

- ✓ 2.0 Grade Point Average (GPA) in Citizenship
- ✓ 2.0 Grade Point Average (GPA) in Scholarship
- ✓ Must pass 4 classes minimum
- ✓

Fall Sports:

Every freshmen is Eligible the First 6 Weeks
Everyone else- Sem. 2 grades from last year are used until the first grading period.

Winter & Spring Sports:

Everyone- Previous grading period grades used
